India Inc. helps India breathe: CII sets up Task Force on oxygen supply chains



With an unprecedented rise in Covid-19 cases and acute shortage of medical oxygen pushing the hospitals in the country to the edge, India Inc has come forward to lend a hand. Industry majors have been stepping forward to keep the supply chain moving and augment the availability of medical oxygen in different parts of the country.

Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) has formed a Task Force on Oxygen Supply Chain to strengthen the oxygen supply in the country by working on domestic capacity enhancement and imports; logistical issues between states including issues of transportation, non-availability of cylinders and policy-level interventions. It has made some critical propositions to the government such as - direct vessels to import the liquid oxygen, removing logistical bottlenecks, reducing transit-time, faster unloading of containers, speedy clearances and transport to the destinations through green corridors, augmenting capacity to produce oxygen using supercritical process. The Task Force has also suggested

that the government could explore G2G mechanisms for getting support in the current health emergency within friendly countries.

The biggest bottleneck is the shortage of cryogenic containers. Tatas are importing 36 cryogenic vessels. In addition, ITC is airlifting 24 Cryogenic ISO Containers, with 20 tones capacity each. It is also exploring the imports of oxygen concentrators and generators for distribution. The Adani Group is importing 4 ISO cryogenic tanks with 80 MT liquid oxygen from Saudi Arabia.

The Industry is also stepping in to help with medical oxygen. Tata Steel is supplying over 600 MT medical oxygen from its plants to hospitals. JSW Steel is also supplying 1000 tonnes per day and plans to ramp up further. The total supply from all its plants to Maharashtra, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu in April 2021 was approximately 20000 tonnes of liquid oxygen. Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) is also supplying liquid medical oxygen upwards of 700 MT per day to Gujarat, Maharashtra, Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Daman and Diu and Dadra and Nagar Haveli. ITC's Paperboards unit in Bhadrachalam has already begun supply of oxygen to identified Government hospitals in the state.

The Commercial Vehicle manufacturers under the aegis of Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) are sensitising and alerting the eco-system to ensure fastest turnaround time for vehicles transporting oxygen. Technologies like track and trace and / or connected vehicles are being leveraged. The support required to keep these vehicles running is also being made available. "While we have been able to ramp up our pace of inoculation considerably, it has to move to a level of 8-10 million people on a daily basis in the next few months. For this, the vaccine output has to increase exponentially from the current monthly level of 65-70 million doses, which would require several measures such as fast-tracked approval for new production capacities, facilitating local manufacturers to produce other brands of vaccines (like Johnson & Johnson and Novavax) in large quantity, ensuring hurdle-free availability of inputs to manufacturers and improving the cold storage facilities for vaccines in the country."
