


"Education and art go hand in hand. What we achieve in education has a big role to play with respect to art and culture. If we can merge both the aspects, it will be a great step forward."

The session brought to the fore the growing interest in India's cultural heritage in the wake of its increasing global influence and how a new generation of artists are serving as India's cultural ambassador.

The digital age has brought new opportunities; it is important to ensure that these opportunities are universally accessible. On November 3, 2023, the India@75 Foundation organised a virtual panel discussion, "Innovating Towards a Digitally Inclusive India@100," to deliberate on what this entails.

Dr Avik Sarkar, Researcher and Visiting Faculty, Data, Technology, and Public Policy, Indian School of Business; Dr Lovneesh Chanana, Sr. Vice President and Head of Government Affairs (Asia Pacific and Japan), SAP; Dr Pavan Duggal, Advocate, Supreme Court of India and Chairman, International Commission on Cyber Security Law; Dr Sarayu Natarajan, Founder, Aapti Institute & Co-Director, Eco Lab; Santha Subramoni, Head, Cybersecurity, Tata Consultancy Services Ltd; and Suryadeep Verma, Senior VP & CMO, Comviva, formed the panel.

The conversation focused on issues such as the need to view digital inclusivity through a broad lens, having a strong dedicated cybersecurity legal framework, and creating a robust digital public infrastructure for data privacy and security.

The discussion also explored innovative strategies for shaping a digital India by 2047, reducing the digital divide, and leveraging digitalisation for an inclusive India.
